Research Focus:

The main body of my research is firmly situated within medical sociology as a sub-discipline of sociology. It encompasses a broad analysis of issues that border on medicine and sociology ranging from illness behavior, women's health, emerging diseases and their prevention, access and utilization of healthcare services, traditional medicine, reproductive health, adolescent sexual health, well-being of the aged, to poverty among others. These have constituted part of my studies with women's health being the pivot of my research focus. The broad horizon of my research escapades, arose from my observations in the society, my experience while growing up as well as the skills developed from the tutelage and assigned responsibilities in the department where I teach. Hence, the idea of investigating into the pressures experienced by these unique groups, the impact of such on work-family life and coping strategies adopted. The recognition of the unique characteristics of women which is evident in their reproductive health and contribution to societal survival, has also informed my research into their access to and utilization of health care services which are largely influenced by their knowledge, attitude and perception. These have formed part of my modest contribution to knowledge.

The ills in society that plunge women into some vices to which they become victims and which in turn affect their health are embedded in my works. It is noteworthy, that some of the observed social problems gave rise to my research on women trafficking both for my bachelor and master's degree. The insights received from these studies also necessitated my focus on another aspect of women's studies which birthed my Ph.D thesis on women empowerment (Microfinance Credits and health-seeking behavior) and further contributed to knowledge on a new and evolving idea on the integration of microfinance as a form of economic empowerment into women's health while revealing the dynamics, challenges and prospects in it. Arising from the enduring attempts to reduce gender inequality, the quest for holistic empowerment of women is an imperative for sustainable development which I humbly seek to achieve in my attempt to contribute to the frontiers of knowledge.

My other researches included investigation into cultural factors, practices and influences on health as well as emerging diseases and prevention. Attempts in these cases were made to draw attention to the influence of socio-cultural factors on the prevalence of these diseases and the need for appropriate interventions. Adolescent sexual health and sexuality education particularly among the female folks, family sizes and its effect on children's health especially

the female as well as the role of traditional medicine as a source of health care that serves the underserved in the society vis-a-vis its utilization, have also attracted my research interests.

From the foregoing, it is apparent that my attention has concentrated on medical sociology issues such as health, illness and health care utilization. I have however narrowed my focus down to women's health and emphasized the need for a holistic empowerment of this vulnerable and marginalized group that is undoubtedly important in ensuring the attainment of sustainable development.
