XV. Research Focus and Contribution to Scholarship

The focus of my research has been institutional capacity enhancement, policy implementation for socio-economic and political development, and effective governance. My research interests are in the areas of: governance and elections administration, public policies and public finance management. In the broad discipline of political science, these are situated in public administration, comparative politics, policy and strategic studies.

I have conducted studies on the effects of the mutually reinforcing relationship between a weak state, abysmal performance by its institutions, and poorly conceptualized as well as badly implemented public policies, resulting in ineffective governance. Starting from my PhD

Thesis in which the factor of a weak state was used in explaining different levels of corruption in a civilian administration and a military regime in Nigeria, several of my research works have emphasized the role of the state. Other sections of my research have interrogated the impact of the environment (culture, history, geography, and ethno-religious considerations) on the performance of government institutions and, in particular, public bureaucracy in Nigeria. I have also used the factor of leadership deficit to explain the prolonged politics of underdevelopment, in which critical elements of democracy such as rule of law, transparency and accountability are regularly compromised. Aspects of my studies have also focused on the exceptional performance of some administrations, both at state and institutional levels, all to buttress the thesis on the directional role of leaders. The important area of security has also attracted my attention and I have conducted studies on military and non-military dimensions of national security imperatives in Nigeria. Emphasis has been placed in the roles of Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) of government with overlapping responsibilities in the country's public policy circle.

Therefore, my major contribution to scholarship has been in the body of my recommendations, which is predicated on the need to restore the functionality of the state and its sensitive institutions by making them autonomous and independent. I have argued that this would not just happen without a more vibrant state-society relationship in which many sectors (professionals, civil society, intelligentsia and other stakeholders) are more interested in public affairs and governance. Drawing from examples of best practices around the world, including instances in Nigeria, this increased involvement is envisaged to help in bringing individuals with strength of character into public life where the political will to strengthen institutions and enforce compliance is required.
